Our praise and worship is like turning the dial on a combination lock. It unlocks what God is giving you at that particular time.

Matthew 24:2-39, Genesis 6:5-15

In Matthew 24, the disciples ask Jesus three questions, which He then responds to:

- When will these things be?
- What will be the sign of your coming?
- What will be the sign of the end of the age?

Jesus begins His response to the disciples with, “take heed that no one deceives you.” We should not be so caught up in the flow of the current world and its practices, nor the practices of denominations, that we forget our assignment: to be the spiritual life alert for the world!
